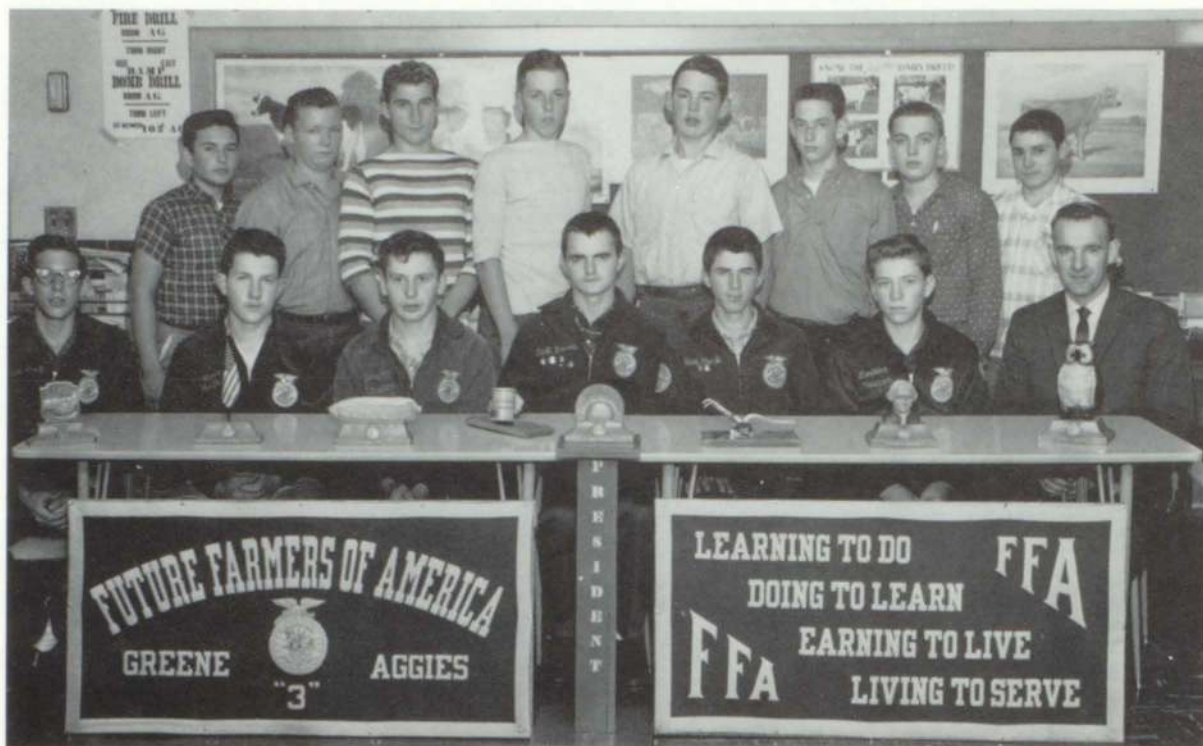
ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION
