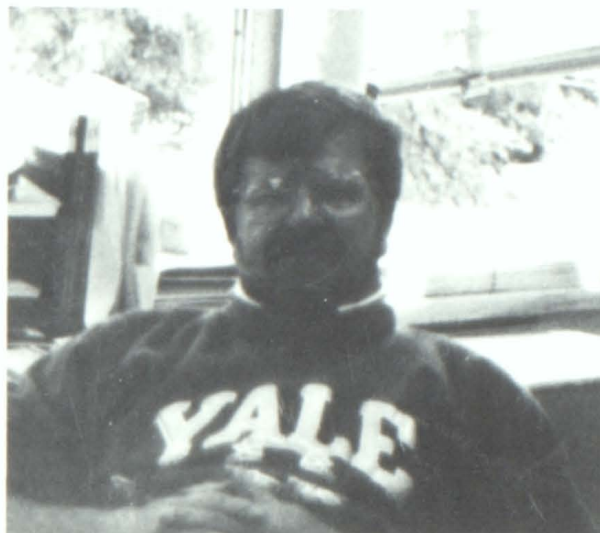
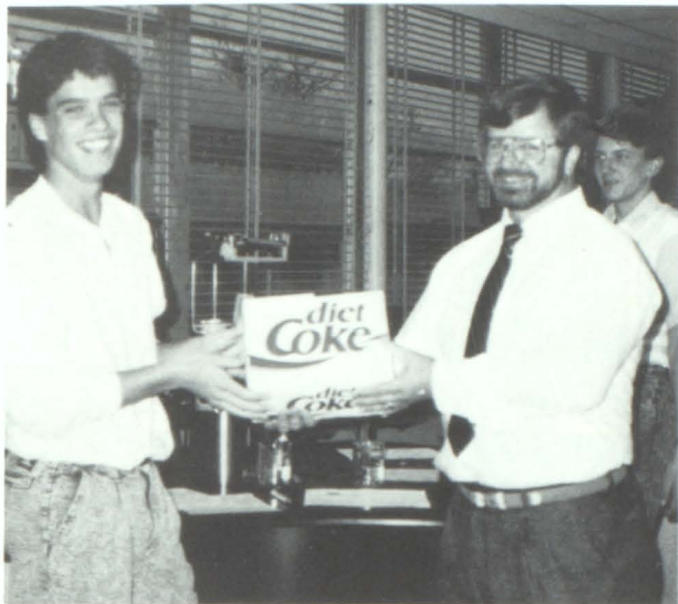
Planning for the future

As the winds that continue to blow.

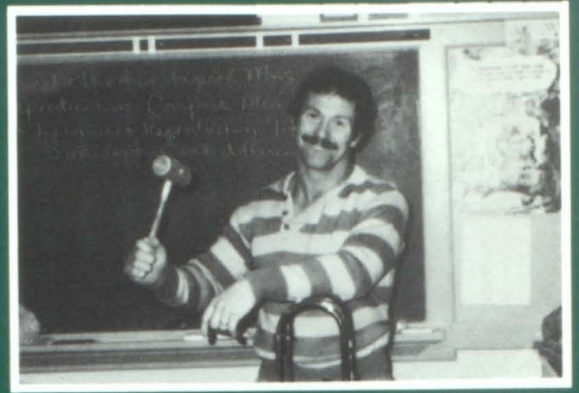

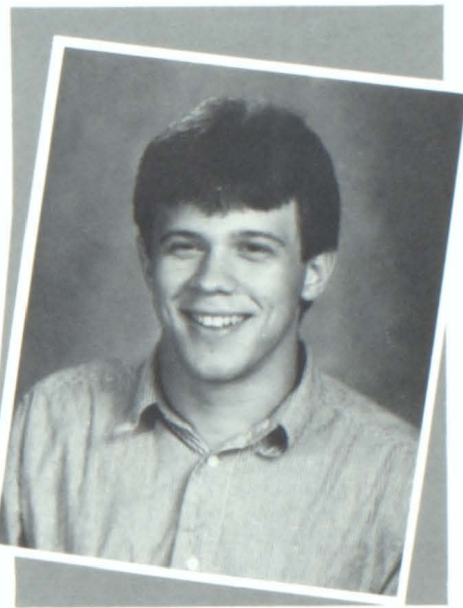
COMMENTS:
