We've shared a lot of laughter, We've fought through all the tears. We've conquered every battle And overcome our fears.



Wednesday, June 29, 1983 A Story of Faith

GREENE - "She was tough and she was the smartest kid and no one will ever replace Laura for her kindness, thoughtfulness and caring." wrote Jenna Phillips in a memorial letter about her friend and classmate, ten-yearold Laura Swenson, who died Tuesday morning, June 21.

Friends and relatives gathered at the Central Baptist Church Friday morning, to say their last farewell "and to worship which helps us overcome our personal grief," said the R.ev. J.J. Koopman, who officiated at the service. "Laura was a light that this earth. Her faith in the Lord gave her strength over the years."

Laura, daughter of John and Ida Swenson, Stillwater Road, Greene, died of cardiac arrest at Wilson Memorial Hospital, and "her story is one of faith," said

About 5 years ago, Laura was dubbed a ''miracle baby'' by one of the many doctors who treated her at a Rochester children's hospital. Just prior to that, Laura wasn't given much hope of life-

only 5 percent of her liver was functioning and she was in a coma. But as her classmate said, Laura was tough. "The doctors didn't know what caused her liver made 'a lasting impression on



to her friends, nothing could keep her down.

"She was happy at the time" wrote her classmate Joe Baird. In another letter the Swensons received from Classmate Stacey Winson, Laura is remembered as 'never complaining about her own problems, but always helping others with theirs."

We treated her fair, we didn't treat her like a baby because she was tough," Jenna Phillips also wrote in her ltter.

No matter who you ask about Laura, the answers are always the same. She was loving, thoughtful, kind and tough. "She



failure and they really can't say what cured her," said her Mom at that time; "but we can-Jesus." In August of 1979 doctors could find no sign of ongoing liver disease, but later other medica! problems began to arise.

Laura developed intestinal problems from the medication used to treat her liver disease which meant she had to remain on a strict diet. During the past year Laura's bones began to get brittle and she suffered three compression fractures of hher back, which kep her in a brace much of the time. But, it seemed



shared the same sense of humor; she was full of life and giving. She gave more to me than I gave to her."

Laura oviously loved her teacher as well. In her diary dated October 1982 Laura wrote, "school is great this year." And included in a list of people she trusted most at the age of 9, Laura wrote "Mr. McMullen".

During the eulogy on Friday, Rev. Koopman challenged those present to look inward to find what impact aura made on gu?" The letters from her classmates show that she touched the lives of everyone she met, and she taught them things.

Mr. McMullen told Laura's mother that he had been trying to impress on his class that you didn't always have to be the best, you didn't always have to win. He told Mrs. Swenson that he kept trying to get that the sage through to the kids. "B the sage got the message across, r h, fold Laura's mother. He found that out through a memorial letter written by Caro Pinto. "Laura said it didn't matter if we didn't win." 'carol wrote, "but to try our best."

"Laura's story is one of faith," said her mother as she tried Sunday to gather her thoughts and go on. "Coping with death is one of the hardest things we ever have to do. Coping with Laura's death is no exception. Laura was an especial part of my life. As for the past year, most of my time has been spent taking care of her, being with her for 13 weeks we spent in the hospital since last March and trying as hard as I could to make Laura's life as normal as we could. But in trying to cope, several things sustain us."

"First," said Mrs. Swenson, "we know where Laura is now. Her faith in Jesus was strong, she was baptized this spring, and we had talked several times in the last few months about heaven and what happans when we die. There is not a trace of doubt in my mind where Laura is now."

"Secondly Jesus is sustaining us. We can feel the prayer support of our friends and families getting us through the days. Mornings seem to be the worst, so I've begun to ask people to pray for us the first thing-and today I felt a difference."

"Thirdly, although our faith and hope have been strong that Laura would some day be completely healed, we have known that each day is a gift from God and that Laura's life has often been precarious at best. She has been very unhappy this year being excluded from the physical aativities the other children enjoy; having to wear a cumbersome brace; being teased .





Laura is enjoying all the things she has missed before in a body made strong and perfect."

Fourthly, we see many ways in which God's timing for Laura has been perfect. She got fatally ill very, very quickly with little suffering. Her life was with us only by the slenderst of threads after we got to the hospital; yet she could feel nothing and we feel the Lord gave us that 24 hours in the hospital to see that holding on was no good, that we had to accept Jesus' healing for Laura (her death), and to let her go to Him. She did after absolutely the best year of her life. She enjoyed every minute in Mr. McMullen's



class and was so thrilled that so many of herfirneds were in that class. Steve McMullen, her other teachers, and her classmates gave Laura and her parents the best of memories."

"We may not see Laura again on this earth, but I never would allow her to feel very sorry for herself and I know she's looking down on us, telling us not bo feel sorry for her-or for ourselves. We only need to try to bring as much joy, love and comfort to each other as she brought to us."

Plans now for memorial contributions through Laura's church, Central Baptist Church in Greene, are to donoate to CROP Walk, the Emergency Squad, the Upper Room Coffeehouse and the libraries.
