time in the United States. Now the Clinton Administration, tempering its earlier enthusiasm for operations, has devised tough new conditions for American participation.

Administration would be willing to have troops join in U.N. peacekeeping if all sides agree to a truce. If not, Washington is committing troops only if its security interests are at stake, and then only if the operation is essential to assure the operation's success and their involvement had broad support from the American people and Congress. Troops would be allowed to serve under commanders if circumstances warranted.

For Robert Dole wants to constrain U.S. participation still further. He would allow American troops to serve in U.N. operations. But he is legislation that would bar the troops from being under foreign command, prohibit U.S. troops from "any standing U.N. army" and cut back on federal funding for U.N. operations.

These steps could sometimes preclude a U.N. operation to U.S. intervention and force American troops to be between playing global cop or doing to keep the peace. The Administration's cautious approach seems more prudent.

Having a U.S. commander take charge makes sense if Americans make up a large share of the force. But why insist on assuming command if the case of Somalia, American troops are being replaced by forces from other countries, would Mr. Dole bar a U.S. com-

transferring command to someone else, as American leaves?

U.S. troops would, of course, remain under the control of the President and could always be withdrawn or engaged that were militarily unsound or that failed to serve American interests. But it sometimes may make sense for American troops to serve under foreign command.

Similarly, refusing to commit U.S. troops to a standing U.N. army is reasonable. But what is wrong with designating an American brigade or two to participate regularly in peacekeeping exercises with foreign forces? That way they could practice working together and would be ready for prompt dispatch if the need arose.

Paying for others to do peacekeeping may, at times, be preferable to sending U.S. troops instead.

To his credit, Senator Dole would insist on Congressional approval before committing U.S. troops to U.N. peacekeeping, and would establish a realistic Pentagon budget for peacekeeping instead of diverting funds from military readiness.

But Congress let President Bush dispatch 30,000 U.S. troops to Somalia without convening to debate the wisdom, and limits, of American involvement. Will it be any more willing in the future to conduct a timely debate and share responsibility for committing troops? And Congress has often been slow to pay the U.S. share of U.N. operations.

In his understandable desire to pull back from ill-fated multilateral efforts, Mr. Dole could force the country into an uncomfortable choice: Intervene alone in international trouble spots, or do nothing. The Administration is right to learn from its mistakes without sounding total retreat.

But nuclear wastes are not classified by level of radioactivity. Unfortunately, it fails, beginning with the contention that the night of the Reichstag fire was a "freezing night" on Feb. 27, 1933 (Rudolf Diels, Gestapo head, wrote in his memoirs that it was "ein regnerischer Vorfrühlingabend," a drizzly pre-spring evening).

The intentions that the Bulgarian Dimitrov was freed in a conspiracy, that the "Night of the Long Knives" when the S.A. storm trooper Ernst Röhm, and the rest of the SS black shirts, and that and Stalin had some tacit understanding (the Ruth Fischer theory would be very convenient. Unlikely, they are most unlikely. There are many theories about the Reichstag fire. All were aired, discredited. The most likely have been that the Nazis set it off themselves, by way of a secret passerm Hermann Göring's newly finished palace. Berlin's Fire Walter Gemppe, who probably the whole story, was arrested and found dead in his cell. Hans the nightclub clairvoyant and confidant, who had quasi-pre-arranged the fire, and who was said to recruited the deranged Dutch Communist who confessed it, was found murdered.

It did matter that the Reichstag fire set off the fear of a Communist coup, which allowed Hitler to demand restrictive new laws, which were then immediately passed by Parliament and confirmed by

for Germany. There was surprisingly little opposition to their passage. Germans wanted to give their newly installed rulers the chance to clean up the mess. In return, German citizens were willing to relinquish most of their precious rights with the new Hitlerian "laws for the protection of the state."

Obviously, this was in Hitler's interest. As for Dimitrov, who was arrested with two other Bulgarian Communists as a co-conspirator in the fire, and who, according to Mr. Koch, was released in an arrangement with the Communists: Dimitrov's testimony in open court, with the international press in attendance, made the clever Göring look like a fool. Dimitrov also successfully hinted that the fire had been set by the Nazis for their own power play. When he finished testifying, it was too late for any Nazi-Communist collusion. The fat was in the fire. There was little to do but to discharge him for insufficient evidence. He later became Prime Minister of postwar Communist Bulgaria.

True, there was some Soviet-German collaboration before the Moscow Pact of August 1939, mainly to do with aviation and trade matters, but in February 1933, neither Hitler nor Stalin was sufficiently aware of the other or prescient about the other's place in the future to strike a deal. Hitler's greatest early talent was his intuition. The Reichstag fire, no matter who set it, gave him the opportunity, in his words, to "use democracy to destroy democracy." JOHN WEITZ

## Getting Money to Help Poor Students

ederal program aimed at improving basic skills of low-income children, known as Title I, needs major revision. Over the years, it has been spread too thin and fail to help the neediest students.

Clinton Administration has put forth a plan to concentrate more money on the disadvantaged students. As Congress begins to debate the bill this week, it should follow the Clinton lead — and go even further.

Title I program has provided remedial instruction in reading, language and math to low-income students. It currently covers more than five million in two-thirds of the nation's schools. In the last year, three separate studies suggested improvements in teacher training, student evaluations and health and social services for needy students.

The biggest issue before a House education subcommittee this week involves funding. Schools receiving Chapter 1 dollars are spread out in 95 percent of the nation's school districts. The Administration proposes new formulas in the \$6 billion program that would shift money from some areas with low concentrations of poor students, including Montana, Nebraska and Maine, to cities like New York, Los Angeles and Detroit with high concentrations of poor children.

Even with the proposed shifts, many schools will still be too short of funds to meet the higher academic standards the Administration wants to

The shortage of Federal funds for basic scientific research can largely be explained by how little the public and politicians are aware that this financing is productive, efficient and cost-effective. The productivity is obvious to readers of scientific journals since each article acknowledges financial support, the vast majority from the Federal government. Yet most people learn about breakthroughs in the lay press, which rarely notes the support for the research.

An article on new developmental genes (Science Times, Jan. 11), for example, names the investigators and their institutions, but the source of funds? Readers would probably conclude that the universities put up the money, but this is almost certainly not the case. ## New York Needs Stronger Ticket-Scalping

To the Editor:

Arnold Diaz deserves the credit he gets Jan. 23 for his popular "shame-on-you" exposés of consumer abuses on New York local television. Particularly his Barneygatte scoop. In that case, he exposed outrageous ticket scalping for a stage show starring Barney the friendly dinosaur.

But government sometimes also takes decisive action right here in ripoff city.

Last month, for example, the Department of Consumer Affairs cited 15 brokers who had scalped Barney tickets for as much as \$200 each.

According to the New York State law that the brokers violated, tickets cannot be resold for more than 10

percent or \$5 more than whichever is greater. Yet well-financed ticket brokers violate this law because they know that the penalties are negligible, and the evidence is often thin.
