Paying for others to do peacekeeping may, at times, be preferable to sending U.S. troops instead. To his credit, Senator Dole would insist on Congressional approval before committing U.S. troops to U.N. peacekeeping, and would establish a realistic Pentagon budget for peacekeeping instead of diverting funds from military readiness.

But Congress let President Bush dispatch 2000 U.S. troops to Somalia without convenient to

30,000 U.S. troops to Somalia without convening to debate the wisdom, and limits, of American involvement. Will it be any more willing in the future to conduct a timely debate and share responsibility for committing troops? And Congress has often been slow to pay the U.S. share of U.N. operations.

In his understandable desire to pull back from ill-fated multilateral efforts, Mr. Dole could force the country into an uncomfortable choice: Intervene alone in international trouble spots, or do nothing. The Administration is right to learn from its mistakes without sounding total retreat.
