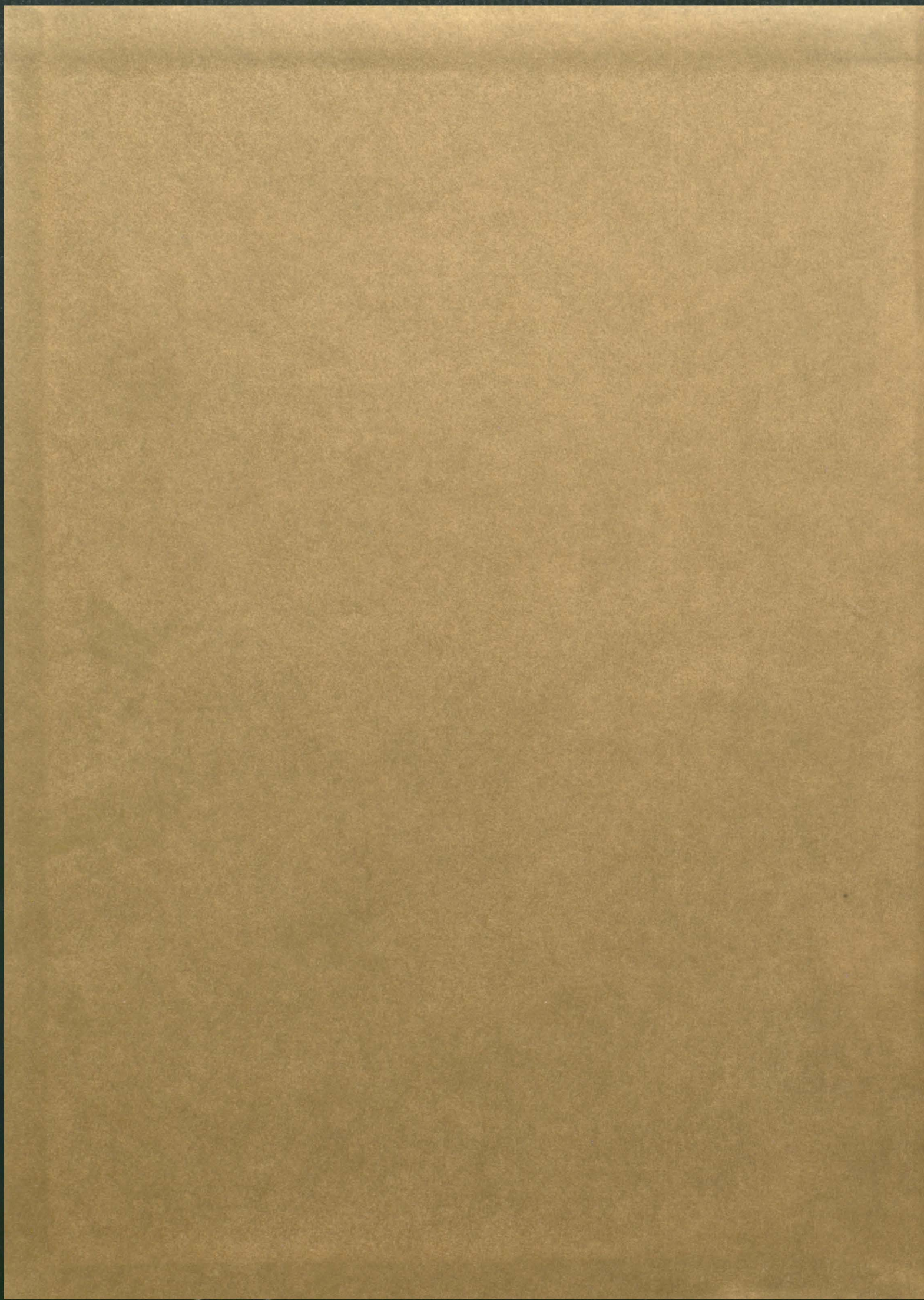


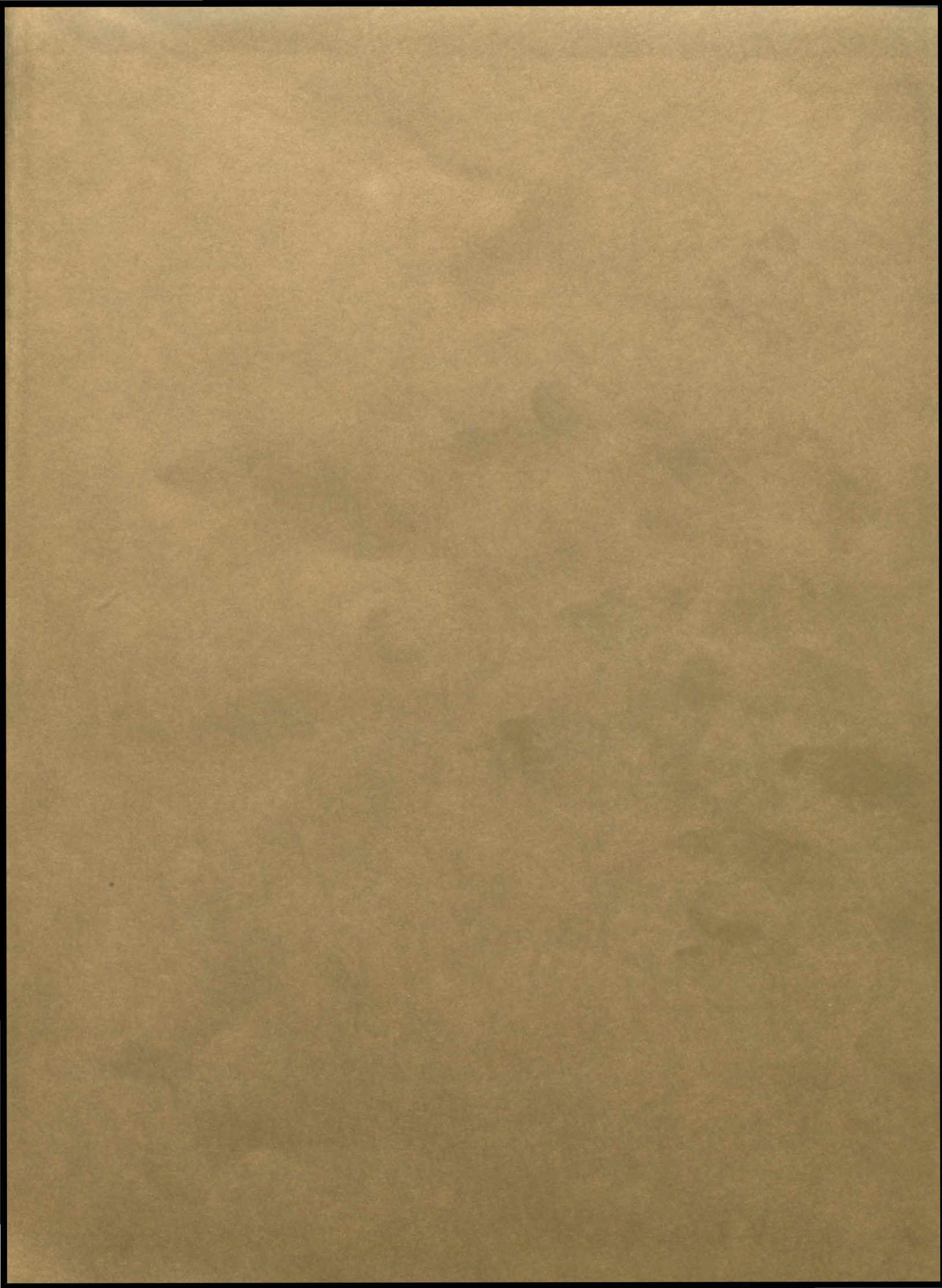

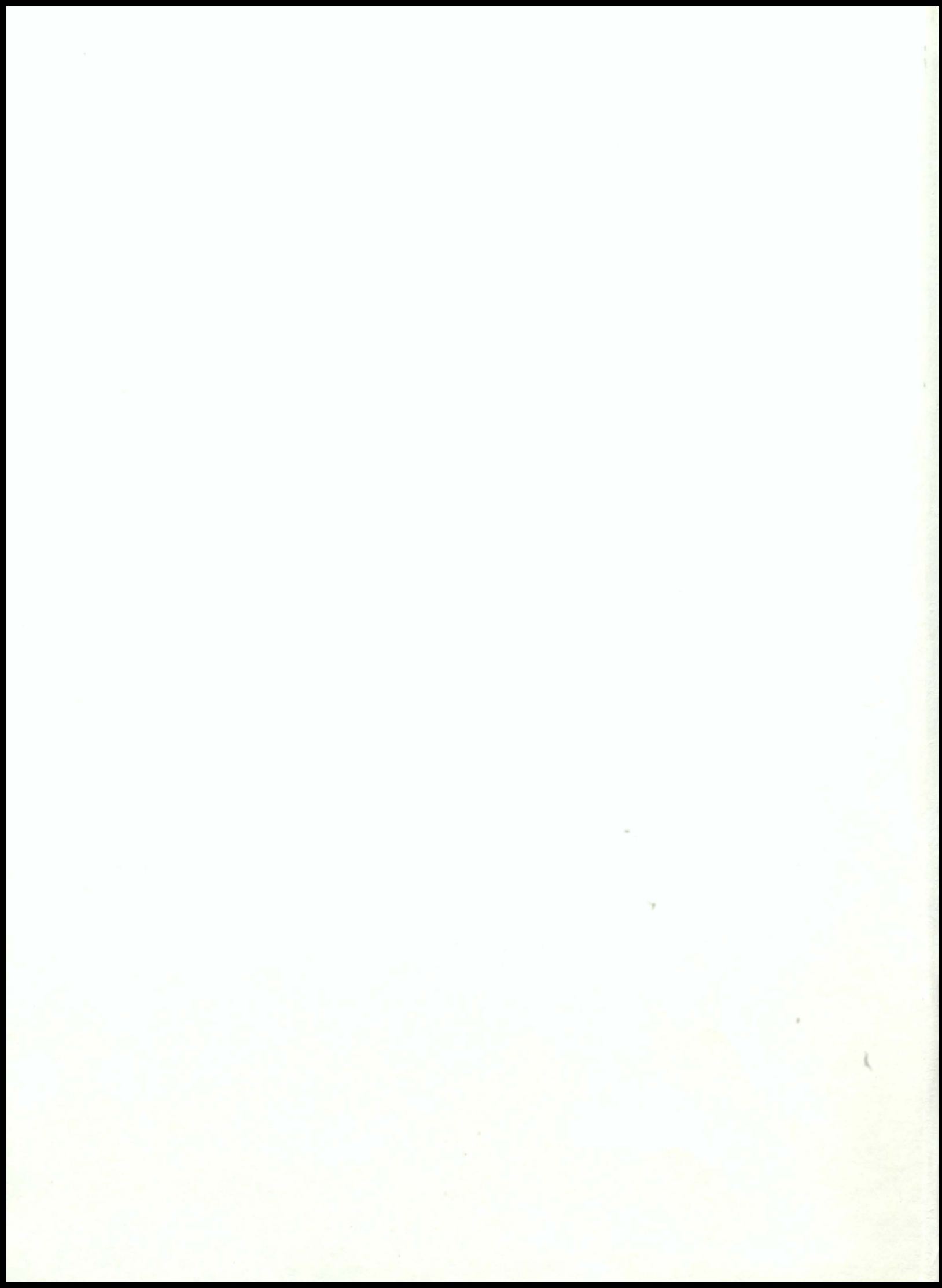

words: age means nothing

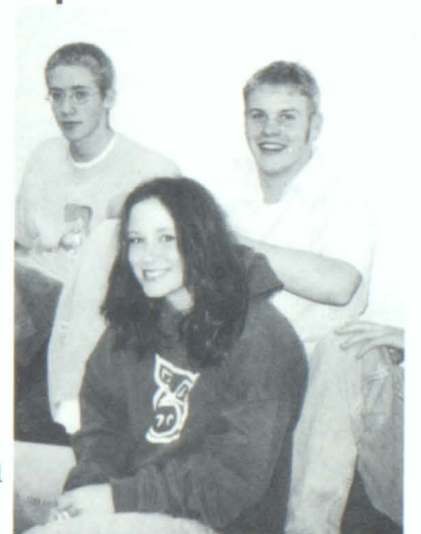
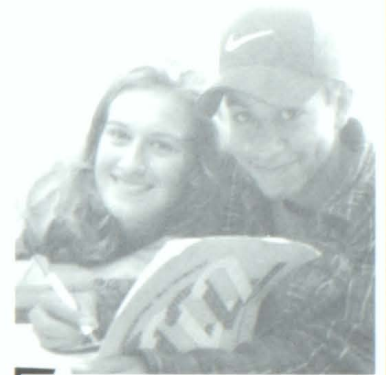
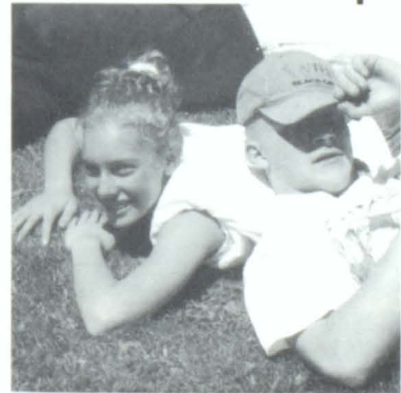

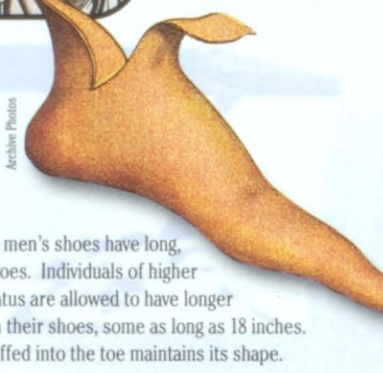

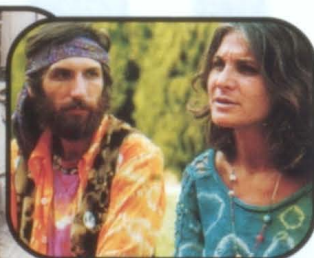

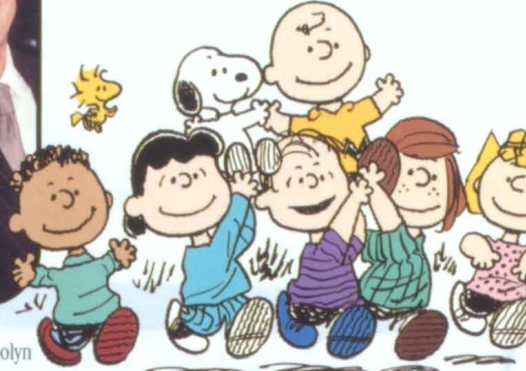

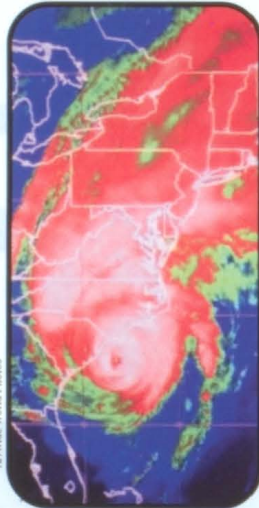

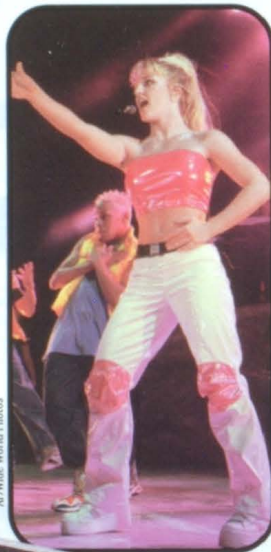

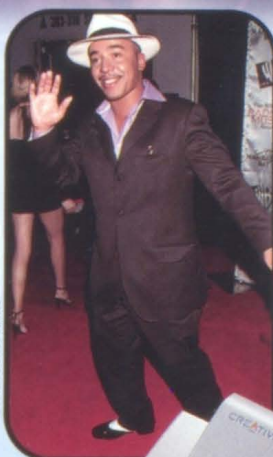

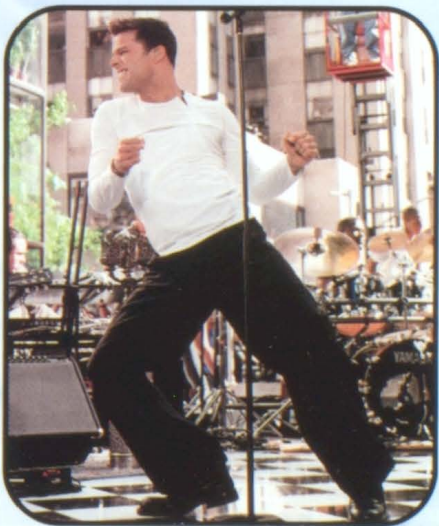

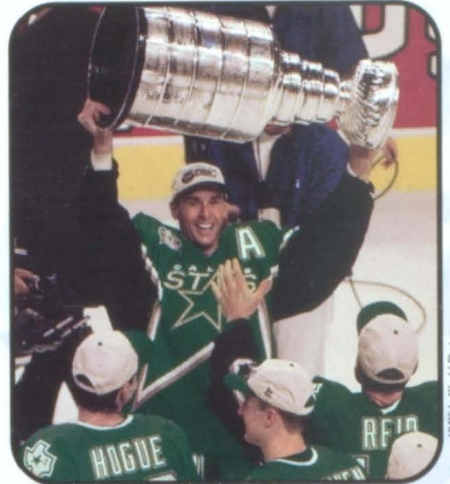

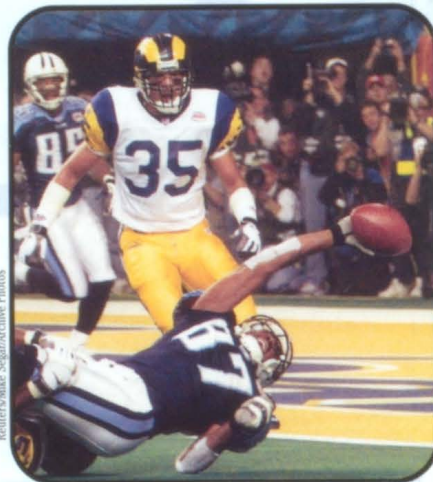

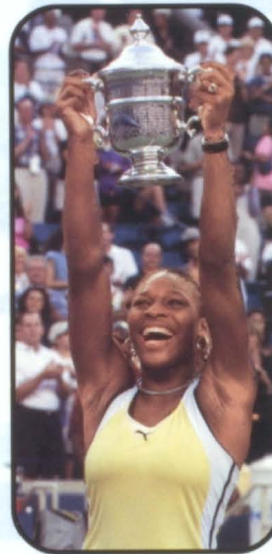
